In total, NOS plans to directly contact about 2000 people with that message. Additional content will be made through web presence and social media. As part of this program, we will be traveling to many locations throughout the state of Nevada and therefore will need reliable transportation in the form of a new vehicle. This vehicle will be housed at the Nevada Outdoor School Winnemucca office and regularly maintained by local, licensed mechanics to ensure top performance and longevity. This program is matching this grant with an additional \$40,181 from a variety of sources.
