1. CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner McKay Calls to order the meeting for Nevada Commission on Off-Highway Vehicles.

Commissioner McKay makes motion to approve September 10, 2019 meeting minutes as written, Fell 1, Parks 2

7. FINANCIAL UPDATE - Kelly Williams, ASO 4

Kelly Williams, ASO 4 provides financial updates of the program as of Dec 2019. She details funding available for grants during 2020 cycle, and expenditures of the program over FY 2019. Projected new revenue of \$945,000 is broken up by amount received by quarter. Kelly informs the commission that the program revenue is staying steady. She continues to detail the values provided in the financial update, noting the program balance remains at \$2.6 million. A note is made that when planning for the future, should all revenue cease today, a buffer remains to payout all active grant projects. Considering all contingencies, Kelly notifies the commission that 1.1 million is available.

Commissioner Baker inquires about the financial summary, and personnel projected for the next year. Kelly Williams provides clarification that the financial spreadsheet is available online, and provides approximately \$100,000 for the program manager salary, insurance, and retirement. Allocations also provide for a small operating budget and travel in and out of the state.

Comm. Baker inquires specifically about the possibility to hire a GIS Analyst for the program, under the new position class for NDCNR.

Kelly clarifies that no official budget request has been submitted to hire a GIS Analyst position for the program. She suggests that this request can be submitted to the interim finance committee or to the 2021 legislative session in August 2020.

8. 2020 NEVADA OHV GRANT APPLICATION SCORING AND AWARDS *FOR POSSIBLE ACTION*-

The Commission will consider Technical Advisory Committee recommendations, ask questions, and score applications. Grant Award decisions will be given to staff to complete funding agreements based on discussion.

Staff clarifies that the Douglas County Search and Rescue Grant was provided to the commission but will not be considered for an award during the 2020 grant cycle. Narkhede provides details about the composition of the Technical Advisory Committee, stating that representatives from USFS, BLM, State Parks, Recreation Trails Program,

Comm. Baker inquires that if the Douglas County SAR Grant is not on the agenda, can it be considered? Counsel Craig Burkett, asks Nikhil to clarify how the misstep was made, and how the grant application was not made available to the public. Nikhil clarifies that the grant in question was uploaded to the website, however marked private so was not included in the agenda items when drafting the meeting agenda.

Discussion of applications with applicant presentations ensued and details can be heard on the audio posted on the OHV.NV.GOV website.

Staff informed the Commission of requests and changes made by the TAC based on online document, "Technical Advisory Committee Notes."

Narkhede reads notes provided by Commissioner Hill:

- Full funding for Nevada Outdoor School
- Full funding for Restoration & Alternative Spring Break from Friends of Nevada Wilderness

High value in providing education via law enforcement agencies as an alternative to citations

OTHER STIPULATIONS ADDED BY THE COMMISSION:

- Nye county OHV Park should receive partial funding of \$150,000 put towards building the OHV Tracks contingent upon viewing plans for the OHV Park.
- The commission is notified by counsel that Search and Rescue projects are not an allowable use of grant funds. As a result, the Douglas County, Moapa Valley Fire, and Las Vegas Metro grant applications will not be considered. Commissioner Fell, makes a motion to remove the Search and rescue grants from consideration.
- Commissioner Booth makes a note that Matt Maples of NDOW was consulted regarding any discrepancies and wildlife impacts that could result from grant projects.
- Commissioners Booth and Fell both voice concerns about the Prison Hill project to not exceed \$150.000.
- Commissioner Malone notes that the Churchill County Sheriff's office will supplement search and rescue operations at Sand Mountain and inquires if the project is viable. Discussion ensues making note that the grant application includes safety, enforcement, and training programs.
- Commissioner Fell makes a condition on the grant to MXT Media to increase motorcycle and singletrack riding and racing in the marketing videos.
- Commissioner Fell makes a condition of the Flat Top Road Repair, that funding is available after the BLM Completes a CX authorizing the repair.
- Re: Green Mountain OHV Trail and Excavator purchase, Miles Gurtler details how the Forest authorizes use of their equipment by trained operators. Commisssioner Fell adds that preference should be granted to OHV focused trail projects.
- Commissioner Booth notes that three machines to Lyon county is extreme. He recommends purchase of one machine until the program is established.
- Counsel Burkett cautions against Law Enforcement conditions of writing citations.

9. 2018 OHV GRANT AWARD EXTENSIONS *FOR POSSIBLE ACTION*
