NEVADA COMMISSION ON OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES

The Nevada Commission on Off-Highway Vehicles promotes safe and responsible use of Nevada's outstanding opportunities for off-road recreation. The program provides grants to fund OHV related projects.

The legal authority for the commission is established by Nevada Revised Statute 490.067. The commission shall:

1. Review applications for grants and award funds from the Fund for Off-Highway Vehicles;
2. Monitor the accounting activities for the Fund;
3. Meet at least four times per year; and
4. Prepare a comprehensive report for each regular session of the Nevada Legislature.

THE GOAL

The Nevada Off-Highway Vehicle Commission's goal is to promote projects on the ground, generate partnerships with clubs, organizations, and Federal, State and Local agencies connected to OHV recreation, and maintain a website for key OHV information, including maps of authorized recreational trails throughout the state, and encourage partnerships to promote trails and establish new trails. We encourage you to contact us to see how we can work together.

THE MEMBERS

The Commission on Off-Highway Vehicles is made up of 11 voting members appointed by the Governor and nine non-voting members. The Commission is responsible for allocating money from the Fund for Off-Highway Vehicles for various projects related to off-highway vehicles.

WHAT IS CLASSIFIED AS AN OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE?

Off-highway vehicle means a motor vehicle that is designed primarily for off-highway and all-terrain use. The term includes, but is not limited to:

- a. An all-terrain vehicle;
- b. An all-terrain motorcycle;
- c. A dune buggy;
- d. A snowmobile; and
- e. Any motor vehicle used on public lands for the purpose of recreation

WHO IS REQUIRED TO REGISTER?

With certain exceptions, every owner of an OHV shall register their OHV. Registration of an off-highway vehicle is not required if the off-highway vehicle:

- a. Is owned and operated by:
 1. A federal agency;
 2. An agency of this State; or
 3. A county, incorporated city or unincorporated town in this State;
- b. Is part of the inventory of a dealer of off-highway vehicles and is affixed with a special dealer license plate;
- c. Is registered or certified in another state and is located in this State for not more than 15 days;
- d. Is used solely for husbandry on private land or on public land that is leased to or used under a permit issued to the owner or operator of the off-highway vehicle;
- e. Is used for work conducted by or at the direction of a public or private utility; or
- f. Was manufactured before January 1, 1976.
- g. Is operated solely in an organized race, festival or other event that is conducted:
 1. Under the auspices of a sanctioning body; or
 2. By permit issued by a governmental entity having jurisdiction;
- h. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (d), is operated or stored on private land or on public land that is leased to the owner or operator of the off-highway vehicle, including when operated in an organized race, festival or other event;
- i. Is used in a search and rescue operation conducted by a governmental entity having jurisdiction; or
- j. Has a displacement of not more than 70 cubic centimeters.

STEP ONE

SELECT THE APPROPRIATE FORM

Registration forms and procedures differ depending on when and where your vehicle was purchased or whether it is homemade. A separate form is needed for each vehicle.

STEP TWO

TAKE APPROPRIATE FORM AND VEHICLE FOR A VIN INSPECTION

A Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) inspection will have to be completed by a licensed Nevada Off-Highway Vehicle dealer or a sworn law enforcement officer if your vehicle has never been registered or titled in Nevada.

PLEASE NOTE: The DMV will not perform VIN inspections for Off-Highway Vehicles.

STEP THREE

COMPLETE APPLICATION AND MAIL IN SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

The dealer who completes the inspection may submit the application and other documents on your behalf or you may mail them yourself. Dealers may charge up to \$2 for each registration and/or title application submitted.

The Nevada Certificate of Title, if issued, is processed separately from the registration decal. All ownership documents will be required to title the Off-Highway Vehicle. The title will be mailed to the lender or other lienholder, if any, or to the owner if there is no lienholder.

PLEASE NOTE:

When you receive your registration decal, affix the decal to the Off-Highway Vehicle. Decals are issued *by mail only*.

Once you've registered for the first time, renewal can be done online or by mail.

GRANT PROGRAM

Any person or group is eligible to apply for a grant. Grant applications may be submitted at various times throughout the year and selection occurs at various times throughout the year.

WHAT IS CLASSIFIED AS AN OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE?

Off-highway vehicles are motor vehicles, such as design of general off-highway use and are not designed for use on public roads.

1. All-terrain vehicles
2. Snowmobiles
3. Dune buggies
4. Recreational off-highway vehicles
5. Any other motor vehicle designed for use on public roads

WHO IS REQUIRED TO REGISTER?

Whoever owns, operates, or transfers an off-highway vehicle must register it with the Nevada Commission on Off-Highway Vehicles.

1. Registered and operated by:
 - a. Private person
 - b. Government
 - c. Any other person

KEY REGULATIONS

An off-highway vehicle (OHV) is defined as a motor vehicle designed primarily for off-highway and all terrain use. The term includes, but is not limited to: all-terrain vehicle (ATV), off-highway motorcycle (OHM), dune buggy, snowmobile, utility vehicle (UTV) also known as side-by-side, or any other vehicle used on public lands for recreation.

NRS 483.580 states that parents can be held for negligence for allowing any unlicensed minor less than eighteen (18) years of age to drive a vehicle upon any public maintained road or highway. All OHV drivers must be licensed or if under sixteen (16) years of age they must be accompanied by an adult licensed driver at least eighteen years old. Any minor under sixteen must be under visual supervision when operating on a county or city maintained road.

Helmets are required for ALL OPERATORS AND RIDERS when operating on a county, town, or city maintained road, including side-by-sides.

All traffic laws of the State of Nevada must be complied with during operation of an OHV.

FAILURE TO REGISTER

The fine for failing to register is \$100 (NRS 490.520). Law enforcement may seize vehicles that are being operated improperly, are stolen or if the VIN has been tampered with (NAC 490 Section 83). Offenses related to a false or fraudulent registration or title are gross misdemeanors or felonies.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

TIPS FOR OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE SAFETY

- + Always fasten your seat belt, wear a helmet and other protective gear and keep all parts of your body inside the Off-Highway Vehicle.
- + Avoid paved surfaces. Off-Highway Vehicles are designed to be operated *off-highway*.
- + Stay on marked trails, don't drive over vegetation, respect all signage and barriers and leave no trace.
- + Drive only in designated areas, at a safe speed, and use care when turning and crossing slopes.
- + Nevada DUI laws apply to Off-Highway Vehicle operators who are impaired by drugs or alcohol, so never operate an Off-Highway Vehicle while under the influence.
- + Never carry more passengers than the Off-Highway Vehicle is designed for, and never allow a passenger who is too small to sit in a passenger seat to ride in the Off-Highway Vehicle.

STEP ONE

SELECT THE APPROPRIATE FORM

Registration forms and procedures differ depending on when and where your vehicle was purchased or whether it is homemade. Visit us online at www.offroadnevada.org and click on REGISTER YOUR VEHICLE to find your form(s).

STEP TWO

TAKE APPROPRIATE FORM AND VEHICLE FOR A VIN INSPECTION

A Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) inspection will have to be completed by a licensed Nevada Off-Highway Vehicle dealer or a sworn law enforcement officer if your vehicle has never been registered or titled in Nevada.

PLEASE NOTE: The DMV will not perform VIN inspections for Off-Highway Vehicles.

STEP THREE

COMPLETE APPLICATION AND MAIL IN SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

The dealer who completes the inspection may submit the application and other documents on your behalf or you may mail them yourself. Dealers may charge up to \$2 for each registration and/or title application submitted.

The Nevada Certificate of Title, if issued, is processed separately from the registration decal. All ownership documents will be required to title the Off-Highway Vehicle. The title will be mailed to the lender or other lienholder, if any, or to the owner if there is no lienholder.

PLEASE NOTE:

When you receive your registration decal, affix the decal to the Off-Highway Vehicle. Decals are issued *by mail only*.

Once you've registered for the first time, your yearly renewal can be done online or by mail.

Any person or group is eligible to apply for a grant. Grant applications may be submitted at various times throughout the year and selection occurs at various times throughout the year.

3. LAW ENFORCEMENT

KEY REGULATIONS

An off-highway vehicle (OHV) is defined as a motor vehicle designed primarily for off-highway and all terrain use. The term includes, but is not limited to, all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), off-highway motorcycle (OHM), dune buggies, snowmobiles, utility vehicles (UV) also known as side-by-side, or any other vehicle used on public lands for recreation.

NRS 440.580 states that parents can be held responsible for allowing any unlicensed minor less than sixteen (16) years of age to drive a vehicle upon any public maintained road on highway. All OHV drivers must be licensed or if under sixteen (16) years of age they must be accompanied by an adult licensed driver at least eighteen years old. Any minor under sixteen must be under visual supervision when operating on county or city maintained road.

Licenses are required for ALL OPERATORS AND RIDERS when operating on a county, town, or city maintained road, including side-by-sides.

All traffic laws of the State of Nevada must be complied with during operation of an OHV.

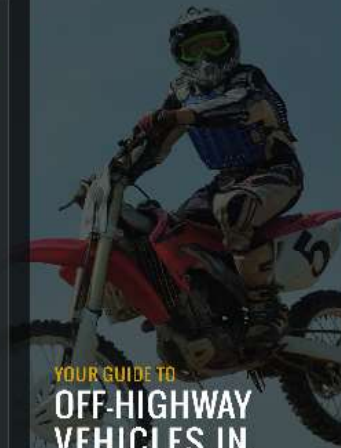

A Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) inspection will have to be conducted on the vehicle. Nevada Off-Highway Vehicle dealers inspect the vehicle number when the vehicle has never been registered in Nevada.

PLEASE NOTE: The DMV will inspect the VIN inspection for OHV license plates.

STEP THREE

COMPLETE APPLICATION AND MAIL IN SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

The dealer who completed the inspection will provide the supporting documentation for you. If you are not a Nevada resident, you may mail the application and supporting documentation to the Nevada OHV website.

The Nevada Department of Public Safety will process the application and issue a license plate for your OHV. The license plate will be mailed to the dealer or you. The license plate will be mailed to the dealer or you.

PLEASE NOTE: The license plate registration fee for the license plate for OHV license plates is \$21.00.

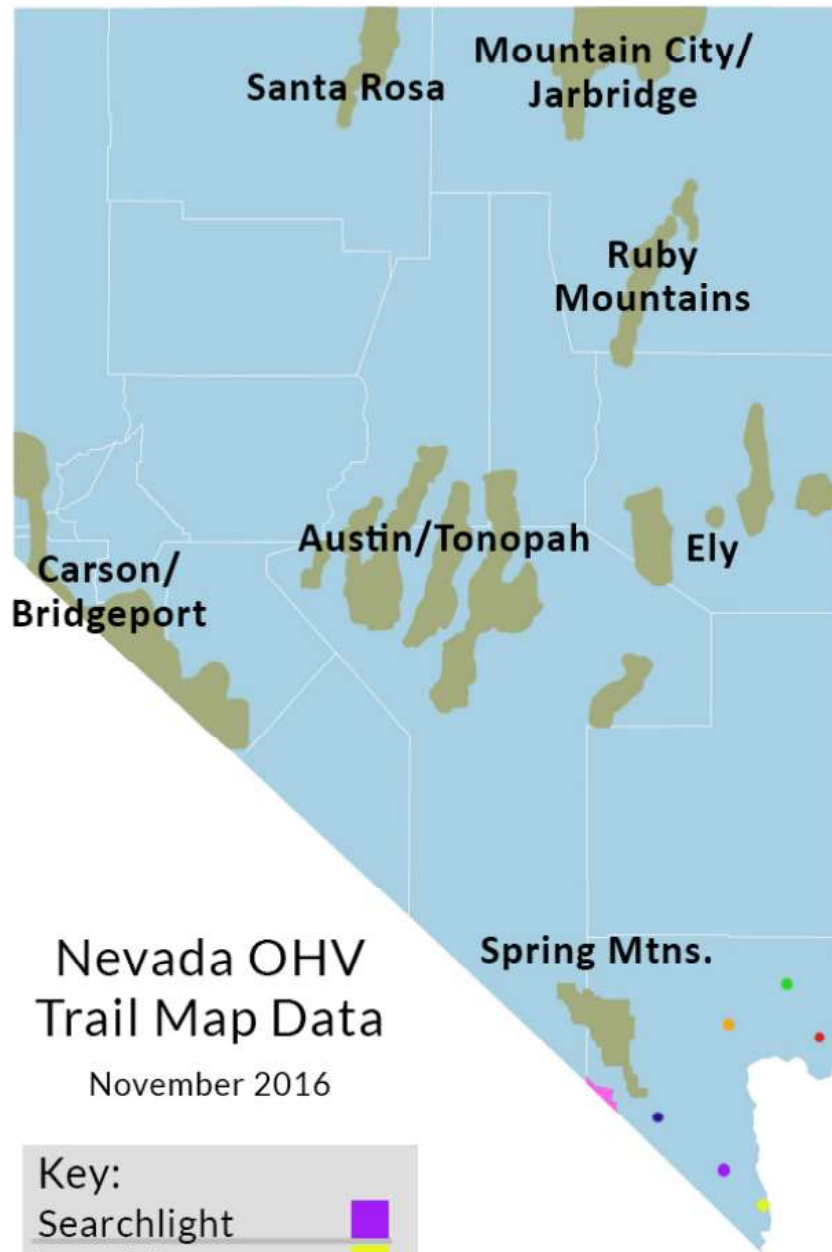
