**RE:** Proposed Permanent Changes to Nevada Administrative Code 490

I, Nikhil Narkhede, Off Highway Vehicles Program Manager, do hereby certify that, to the best of my knowledge or belief:

Pursuant to NRS 233B.060, the proposed administrative regulation changes are not likely to (a) impose a direct or significant economic burden upon a small business, or (b) directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a small business.

The Nevada Off Highway Vehicles Program has determined that its proposed changes have no significant negative effect on Nevada Small Businesses and have a potential positive benefit to the economy. Proposed changes are related to the administration of Nevada OHV grants and submitting documents for OHV Registration.
