Type here: Hills Angels 4x4 Club proposes remediation, decommissioning, blockage and signage of the Big Meadows of Hunter Lake area within the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest. The work will include remediation of wayward wheelers and the decommissioning of unauthorized user-created trails through Big Meadows and a smaller watershed directly adjacent thereto. (Exhibit 3). (Any decommissioning of unauthorized trails will be done at the direction of USFS). We will use existing log barriers and strategically place new barriers around Big Meadows to prevent access into the wetlands. We plan to utilize fallen timber and rock adjacent to the trail and place it in a way that compliments the scenery while disallowing motorized access to the meadow. (Sample of available materials identified in Exhibit 4). At these points and where designated we will install USFS approved carsonite signs and hope to add Adopt-a-Trail signage. (Exhibit 5). Hills Angels plans to execute the remediation work as soon as the ground clears from snow and is workable; blockage and decommissioning will occur thereafter; with the signage to be installed last. The target date to complete all work within the geographical scope of the project by Fall of 2021.

Hills Angels already hosts a minimum of two volunteer clean-up days per year in coordination with Keep Truckee Meadows Beautiful. Next year we hope to collaborate with another OHV organization such as Reno Area Dirt Riders and commit to two clean-up efforts in 2021

Hill Angels has a long history of assisting stuck and stranded OHVer's in the Truckee Meadows and is periodically called upon by Federal and local law enforcement to assist in "recovery" operations. Additionally, Hills Angels, as a longstanding licensed 4x4 club wishes to join and be heard within the community served by OHV Commission. Our group and many organizations like ours, as well as individual non-affiliated enthusiasts, recreate on off-road trails throughout the Silver State.

Hunter Lake Trail is the premier local 4x4 trail in the greater Reno-Sparks area. This trail has gained the attention of professionally built rigs looking to test their most recent investment, as well as the novice wheeler with their first 4x4. The trail is extremely accessible: both ends of the trail are mere minutes from the downtown and due to the variety of terrain it will surely entertain all who venture up the trail.

In the early 2000's Hill's Angels officially adopted the trail and since then have worked to maintain the trail for all who use it. Unfortunately, some choose to utilize areas in ways that are less than responsible. Specifically, in recent years the area referred to as "Big Meadows" has seen its fair share of wayward wheelers looking to gain a new perspective of the meadow. The evidential path these sojourners leave can now be seen from space, immortalizing their disrespect for the scenery and for future off-road enthusiasts.

Hills Angels organizes at least two club rides in the Hunter Lake/Big Meadows area per year. During each of those events necessary monitoring and maintenance will be performed. Hills Angels further intends to grow its efforts and identify other projects and areas in need of stewardship through the OHV Grant Program in upcoming years which will directly relate to this geographical area thus increasing the monitoring and necessary maintenance of this project.
