

The Carson City District has a long history of motorized recreation use dating back to the 1950's. In the last 60 years the advancements in technology have brought more and more people out onto their public lands to recreate. This valid form of recreation is sustainable if managed utilizing the three E's approach to recreation management (Engineering, Education, and Enforcement). The grant proposal will address all three E's.

Engineering: This grant will help with the development of kiosks and two learners loops at Sand Mountain Recreation Area.

Education: Education will be both passive and active, utilizing the NOHVCC adventure trail program for children, the learners loops, and the development a Volunteer Trail Ranger Program for adults. The trailer will be "wrapped" in the adventure trail program educational panels. The UTV and the trailer will be utilized for staff to be at events: Halloween at Sand Mountain, Memorial Day at Moon Rocks, Vegas to Reno Race, etc. to provide the educational material. These events take place on nights, weekends, and holidays in remote areas. These remote areas require onsite camping and equipment we currently do not possess.

Enforcement: Approximately 25% of the grant will be utilized for Law Enforcement; specifically to enforce safety issues, resource protection, and OHV registration.

2. Trail mapping, signing and maintenance of existing trails and facilities: Please describe how your project/program assists in the maintenance and/or rehabilitation of Existing Facilities. "Taking care of what is already there to protect the investment."

Maintenance of existing staging areas, learners loops, kiosks and facilities is an ancillary portion of this grant. The goal of education and enforcement is to decrease the negative impacts of recreationalists (shooting signs, dumping, graffiti, off trail riding, riding in closures, etc.) and increase compliance. Increased compliance will decrease maintenance costs and help keep public lands open for motorized recreation.

3. Training: Please describe the goals and objectives of your public training program, i.e., Public Education, Rider Classes, Safety, Trail Building, or Outdoor Ethics. Number of people trained, contacts made, etc.

The goals of the Carson City District BLM education and enforcement grant are (1) establish an education program that will help improve rider safety, especially for children. (2) Establish a pool of highly motivated volunteer trail rangers to help with OHV registration compliance, rider safety, and Tread Lightly principals

4. Law Enforcement, SAR with NO Registration component: How will your officer training, equipment purchase or salary/overtime request serve the off-highway vehicle recreating public?

BLM LEO's and staff are crossed trained in first aid, first responders, EMT's, and paramedics. These LEO's and staff are often the only line of communication to EMS in remote locations through the use of radios. The funding of additional shifts for LEO's will help support OHV recreationalists in these outlying areas.

5. Access: Please describe how your project/program ensures protection of access. Explain what access/opportunities would be lost or restricted if the project doesn't occur.

The Carson City District BLM education and enforcement grant ensures protection of access by empowering the OHV community to "educate and police their own". This will result in the protection of current and future OHV opportunities. The grant also ensures that if education is not enough to stop damaging OHV use, law enforcement will be available to issue citations if needed.

6. Economic Integration: Please describe how your project/program develops outdoor recreation opportunities that help local, regional, or state economies grow (e.g., economic impact, additional OHV funding sources, improved user or business group participation, Road use resolutions and OHV friendly Communities.)

Carson City District supports several forms of recreation on public lands, this includes OHV use. From large cities like Reno to the small towns like Fallon, to tiny towns like Mina, the economic impact of motorized recreation is felt through the purchase of gas, food, hotels, equipment, and repairs. From an economic stand point, there is not a city or town in the Carson City District that will not benefit from this grant.

7. Connectivity/Loops: Please describe the increase in connectivity between trails, facilities and other locations that your project/program would provide or enhance when completed.

The majority of OHV opportunities on the Carson City District are roads and trails linked together through a series of user created networks. These networks can be complicated and difficult to navigate when users are not familiar with the area. One of our education

- goals is to help better prepare OHV enthusiasts before they are lost or break down, or operate in an inappropriate area (OHV closure, Wilderness Study Area, fire closure, etc).

Education is directly related to keeping OHV roads, trails and areas open for OHV us by empowering the users to "Do the Right Thing". Enforcement helps keeping areas open by stopping individuals who do not want to do the right thing and are misusing the land in a manner that could potentially lead to an OHV closure (riding off trail, riding in a closure, dumping, shooting signs, etc). There is no new NEPA associated with this project, however the existing leadership goals include both education and enforcement of current OHV rules and regulations.

9. Partnering and Leverage: Please describe coordination that has occurred with stakeholders, partners and the public in which all interests have had an opportunity to be heard related directly to this project/program. The Carson City District BLM has partnered with NOHVCC regarding the education component of this grant. The volunteer trail ranger program is developed due to the direct input from OHV enthusiast who want to help keep public lands open to OHV use. Due to the reintroduction of the OHV grant system club partnerships are not in place at this time but will be developed as part of this grant. These partnerships have existing in the past (Fallon four-wheel drive club, pine nut mountain trails association, and several others); as clubs develop and sometimes fade away, our goal is to partner with current clubs specifically interested in OHV opportunities.

10. Demand for New Facilities: Please provide justification (the demand) for NEW facility/program development: restrooms, trails, signs, and other amenities.

The only new facilities associated with this grant will be the two learners loops located at Sand Mountain Recreation Area. The demand has been in the form of several user created tracks in the designated camping area. Often times these user created loops are unsafe, utilizing high speed roads, and are not sustainably built.

Maintenance: Although this OHV grant program requires maintenance of all facilities funded for 25 years or the normal life of the project, please describe HOW your project will be maintained and WHO has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or continuation of the service/program. This program has commitment from the Stillwater Field Office, Sierra Front Field Office, Law Enforcement and the Carson City District of the BLM. 

The Adventure Trail program has been developed over more than a decade and features artwork by Robert Van Nood highlighting safe and responsible use messaging aimed at young riders. A major factor contributing to the success of Adventure Trail is the unmatched artwork that draws attention from young and old audiences alike.

NOHVCC has invested heavily in the production of the artwork and has been pleased with the results. Recently NOHVCC worked with Van Nood to develop a series of new posters featuring Recreational Off-Highway Vehicles. As the attached invoice indicates, there are considerable expenditures necessary before an Adventure Trail poster is available for use.

The total for the creation of four new posters and the necessary layout and print file prep totals \$11,275. This is all pre-production. Any organization or agency that takes advantage of this artwork to promote safe and responsible OHV recreation is getting considerable value and is free from outlaying the expenditures necessary to create similar artwork. As a result, NOHVCC will require a licensing agreement for extensive use of this work like the trailer proposed by the Carson City District of the Bureau of Land Management.

Further, NOHVCC believes the contribution of artwork for projects like the proposed trailer should be considered an in-kind contribution for grant match purposes. While the complete value invested by NOHVCC in Adventure Trail is impossible to calculate, we believe the attached invoice is indicative of costs associated with the development of 16 total posters and other artwork. While the development of the entire suite of Adventure Trail art is certainly many times the costs associated with development of the four recent posters, we respectfully submit that the Carson City District of the Bureau of Land Management should be able to use the \$11,275 represented in the attached invoice as match for its proposed Adventure Trail trailer.
