Please explain how you intend to manage user interactions: The Safe Rider Education Workshops and Safety Fair includes several ATV Safe Rider education courses for youth, teens and adults and will be interactive as well as, lecture for the safety course. We will use the ATV Safety Institute Safe Rider booklets, ATV inspection and maintenance customized checklists, ATV safety handouts and guides from manufacturers, and other training documents for the safety courses. In addition, we will be distributing and training ATV riders on the State of Nevada off-road vehicle registration requirements and how to fill out the forms to register their personal vehicles. We will manage our user interactions by evaluating the students throughout the training course, have them complete evaluations and take a quiz to demonstrate their understanding of the safety course materials. Each rider will be given an age appropriate or vehicle inspection checklist and guide to help reinforce what is required for evaluating their personal ATV prior to taking it out for a ride. We will cover the requirements each rider needs to follow to preserve our natural resources and prevent damage to the environment by riding only on designated trails. We will provide the trails maps and where to go online to investigate and download the approved trail systems for ATV riders. The OHV Safety Rider Course will include five specific areas: 1. Equipment inspection and maintenance of tires, oils and drive train pre-ride checklists, 2. Selection and reason for wearing personal protection safety devices to preserve rider health and safety, how to select and fit the rider to the appropriate size vehicle (youth, teens and adults), 3. State of Nevada vehicle registration and their enforcement requirements to stay off public roads and how to do so prior to going for a ride, 4. Limitations of ATVs for riding on all terrains, 5. ATV vehicle demonstrations of ATV equipment, selection and demonstration of appropriate PPE personal protection equipment for youth and adults, basic first aid for accidents, and the explanation of proper equipment use. Students will be engaged and have the ability to interact with knowledgeable instructors and area regional state and local representatives who protect our public lands.

Type here: Our goal for this grant is to hold <u>five weekend OHV Safe Rider Educational</u> Workshops and Safety Fairs in five municipalities in rural and urban communities within the State of Nevada. The towns/cities are: Tonopah, Ely/Pioche, Clark County/Henderson, Clark County/Pahrump, and Yerington/Carson City areas. We will coordinate and include partnerships at our OHV Safe Rider fair with stakeholders from ATV off road clubs, local area emergency management teams, municipalities, State of Nevada for vehicle registration paperwork requirements and submissions for off road environmental protection, and area towns to help them in promoting their town and for offroad fun. Our Safe Rider Safety Education Workshop and Safety Fair Program focuses on the safe riding OHVs and registration by: 1) 2) Pre-equipment inspections prior to use 3) ATV maintenance 4) State of Nevada vehicle registration 5) Nevada State's OHV trail system 6) OHV Rider's best practices for rider safety during outdoor activities in Nevada including basic first aid when accidents occur and 7) Proper selection, inspection, operation of all safety gear, 8) ATV limitations on all terrains and how to avoid accidents that may lead to death or injuries. The safety fairs will include longtime OHV users, licensed OHV trainers, and manufacturer's representatives who can educate the students on how to keep their machinery in top condition, discuss unique characteristics and use limits for each machine and provide a few quick machinery fixes that may be done to get the user back up onto the trail to use for fixing equipment. We will cover how to be a good steward to the environment and what roads ATVs are allowed to be on and cover the Nevada OHV trail system. It is expected that we will have an ATV club to set up a off road rides for users which will include a narrative of the area and the goal to pick up trash that is found along the trail system.

The first quarter of 2020 will be spent on developing and outlining the stakeholders' responsibilities and selection of the weekend where the Safe Rider Educational Workshops and Safety Fairs will be held. The current time line is to hold the weekend safety fairs in the following months and complete all of the grant requirements by the end of November 2020. Safety Fairs: 1. April 2020 Clark County and City of Henderson, 2. May 2020 Tonopah Safety Fair, 3. June 2020 Ely/Pioche, 4. September 2020 Yerington/Carson City and 5. September/October 2020 Pahrump/Clark County.

Southwest Compliance Safety and Training Institute (SWC Safety) staff has 30 years of experience in providing safety training classes for many businesses and organizations throughout the State of Nevada. SW Compliance and Safety Training Institute, (SWC Safety) is dedicated to protecting human and health and safety through

educational workshops that promote public and worker safety. The Off-Highway Vehicle, OHV Safe Rider Workshop and Safety Fair events are designed to protect the public and riders, assist in validating the off-Highway Vehicle inspections and completion of their Nevada ATV (All-terrain Vehicle) registration paperwork for submittal to the State of Nevada, and educate the youth and adults on safe riding techniques. The OHV Safe Rider Fairs will include local municipal and state personnel to assist the public in vehicle registrations and education on the OHV rider trail system and State of Nevada Road Safety Requirements and Regulations such as prohibiting riding on public highways and streets. Knowledge is a powerful prevention technique and the educational fair will help the ATV riders to understand where they may safely ride in each Nevada region, where the ATV trail systems are located and what State of Nevada Laws regulating the safe and lawful use of OHVs. At our OHV Safe Rider Education Workshop and Safety Fair, invitees from local and/or state agencies may display materials to educate the public on ATV safety, ATV legal roads, and ATV registration methods and submissions. Included in every class are the State of Nevada regulations and locations of the OHV trail systems to include:

- Emphasis on ATV/OHV Rider Safety
- NV OHV Vehicle Registration Requirements and How to your ATV Prepare and submit documents for Registration
- ATV inspection, equipment maintenance, and limitations for rider safety while out off-roading on all terrains
- NV Stakeholders to on-sit VIN verification for registration, if available
- Selection of appropriate sized OHV for youth, teens and adults
- Selection and reasons behind the use of PPE for rider safety and health and how to properly maintain and clean and store rider safety gear
- State of Nevada approved Off-road trail system and Nevada restrictions for use of ATVs on public roads.

SWC Safety staff have traveled the State over the past 30 years and have established relationships with many Nevada emergency managers and have ridden OHV vehicles during club events. Our personal contacts combined with our knowledge on safety regulations is an effective way to bring people together to better understand OHV registration regulations, Off-road trail regulations, machine operation and personal safety. We have established stakeholders to partner with our non-profit to provide training space, parking areas and help set up displays for the safety fairs. Training will be discussed in a group setting either outdoors or inside a community building or center. Holding these events within a town's center will help advertising these events locally to maximize the number of attendees. The emphasis of the classroom training will include best practices for rider safety and OHV registration, how it's accomplished and VIN (vehicle identification numbers) numbers verified by either a dealer or regulatory authority.

OHV safe rider workshop will increase the public OHV's safety awareness through our youth and adult safe rider workshops. The emphasis on the rider safety educational courses includes:

- 1) Safe rider videos, inspect, ride and operate these vehicles on various terrains
- 2) The differences in selecting ATV to match the age and size of riders for safe rider strategies and basic first aid when accidents occur. The safety fair and workshop with focus on Nevada designated trail system and the regulatory requirements in Nevada for where not to ride these vehicles. Where it is illegal to ride OHVs such as public roads. Each course is approx. 2 hours to complete and includes quizzes for student comprehension for a cert of completion. An ATV safe rider demonstration will be provided by our licensed ATV safety trainer

SWC Safety staff will bring OHV regulatory and safety awareness to communities in rural Nevada as well as Las Vegas through our community partnerships, personal relationships, and community organizations. The training effort will include setting up a designated venue at a predetermined advertised location. The class will address vehicle registration, vehicle safety inspection, awareness of designed OHV trails, ecological stewardship, personal safety gear, hazards in desert recreation and basic first aid. Equipment will be displayed at the training session event to point out safety features, proper operation and the safety gear to worn during riding.

2. Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities: Describe the maintenance intervals for your project. How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will your project hold a maintenance/ trails enhancement event? Southwest Compliance and Safety Training Institute staff have backgrounds in earth sciences through formal education in environmental science. This knowledge and the distribution of pamphlets, Nevada maps of trail riding areas will be a major part of the training program for each location. Our personal knowledge of the back roads of Nevada and the complexity of different types of terrains an ATV user may encounter will be beneficial for the students to understand the hazards they may face when they are untrained and unprepared for our unique climate and landscape. This proposal is for training and a safety fair set up to distribute educational materials and meet other OHV enthusiasts. We will emphasize the ethics and responsibility of all OHV users to use existing trails as designed to ensure future OHV use remains permissible and legal by following State of Nevada and Federal regulations. At each training site we will work to partner with regional ATV enthusiasts and clubs to plan good riding events while ensuring environmental stewardship and general trail cleanness.

Southwest Compliance and Safety Training Institute main objectives or goals are to reach as many residents in their local area to emphasize OHV regulations, safety and environmental protection of existing road and the preservation of Nevada's natural

resources by teach good stewardship, prevent damage to delicate plant species, and preventing off road trail blazing. It is estimated that at each rural location there will be approximately 35 to 40 attendees who are active in OHV recreation. Outreach materials consisting of internet postings, fliers, media announcements will be made to notify as many OHV enthusiasts as possible for the planned class event. The training emphasis will be on operator safety through community outreach events. The goal is to provide youth and adult OHV users a better understanding of the dangers of the equipment, proper maintenance and inspection techniques, stability of ATVs on all terrains use and the impacts it can have on our natural resources. The public education, rider classes will address how to select and use basic safety protection equipment needed for riders and the reason for their use to prevent injuries.

The proposed class locations may be co-located with existing OHV trails, but to reach the most community residents the training locations will be in the local civic communities. The trail maps will be provided at these events to identify where designated trail locations can be accessed along with parking for vehicles and trailers. The existing trails will be discussed and where these areas can be accessed easily.

The Southwest Compliance and Safety Training Institute training program will include education to attendees on the best management practices for preserving the environment, preventing damage to plants, prevent fires by stopping vehicles on dirt and not dried out plants and the implications of not abiding by the Federal, State, and Local laws. The education program will explain why Off-roading outside of designated OHV trails can harm the natural ecosystem, sensitive plants, endangered species and any historical cultural areas in the area. Education of where designated trails are located will be provided during the training class. The class will identify any specific environmentally sensitive areas near their trail riding locations and discuss any potential fines that might occur for damaging the environmental habitat.
