This staging area affords the Nye County Sheriff Office (NCSO) or other LEO a central location to provide outreach, education and registration events to OHV users.

Planning, Environmental Studies, Conservation: Describe how the environmental studies, conservation and/or planning will mitigate resources impacted by OHV recreation. How will your project contribute to the conservation of our natural resources, while enhancing OHV opportunities?

Like all purpose-built staging areas this reduced the damage caused by riders pulling off existing trails or roads to load and unload. With the addition of a educational messaging, it affords the opportunity to educate users with positive conservation and etiquette values from a central location.

Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities: How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will your project hold a maintenance/ trails enhancement event? HOW will your project be maintained and WHO has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or trail (note: a minimum of 2 maintenance/ trail events are required per year).

This project allows for purpose-built access to public lands, trails and routes. Kiosks will have mapping, cultural and fauna information, a on them as well as positive (Tread Lightly!) stewardship messaging. The Bighorn Outback Explores will monitor and facilitate minor maintenance tasks as they develop, typically a pre- and post-season cleanup of the area, cleaning of the cattle guards and weed prevention as needed.

Training: Please describe the goals and objectives of your public safety training program. Is it a nationally recognized certification? What sets your safety training program apart from the others?

This facility, located across the street from the school, allows adequate space to host OHV training, including the Nevada Outdoor school's youth OHV program, should that group desire to hold the Ride Safe Ride Smart youth program in Beatty.

Connectivity/Loops: How will the project impact connectivity of OHV trails, facilities, and local communities? Please include maps of areas impacted by your project and describe those impacts.

This facility is a central staging area along the western OHV routes, including the Pahrump to Beatty segment of the Battleborn Trail This area is adjacent to some of the competitive routes that have had the appropriate NEPA studies completed, and is an

ideal staging point for riders who want to traverse the area both North to Goldfield and beyond but easterly to the Amargosa Dunes, and valley.

Access: Please describe how your project improves OHV access in the project area. Explain what access/opportunities would be lost or restricted if the project does not occur.

This part of western Nye County does not have a purpose-built staging area, having an area large enough to accommodate trailers to provide access to more than 7000 miles of OHV trails and roads will be an integral part of protecting OHV access. The facility is configured to keep the protected wild burro out of the staging area that enhances the user experience, as well as providing a single focal point to access our Public Lands by Nevadans and visitors alike.

Trail mapping and signing of existing trails and facilities: If a mapping component is included in the grant, please describe how it will be integrated with the current web mapping application found on OHV.NV.GOV

With installation of additional Kiosks and related signage in phase 2, the facility will include Maps of the local area, historic sites, and routes that protect access by keeping riders on existing trails errors corrections or updates will be provided the NV OHV Program for mapping revisions.

Partnering and Leverage: Who else is involved in this project? Please describe outreach with stakeholders, partners and local governments, that you have communicated with in planning this project.

Bighorn Outback explorers has partnered with NVORA to facilitate this grant. After phase one is complete we will be leveraging the offroad educational partners to develop interpretive signage with consistent messages as other locations in Nevada. Other partners in support are Beatty Senior Center, Beatty Town Advisory Board, and will add value to the local offroad tourism community.

Economic Integration: How will this project improve OHV recreation opportunities that help local, regional, or state economies grow?

This improvement is specifically targeting the tourist visit from Nevadans and those from the UT/CA/AZ riding communities. It allows individuals to stay in town, with the opportunity to have a wide open staging area with, after phase 2, shade structures nearby. Creating an ideal place to start and finish from. Additionally, when groups are conducting offroad events, the economic input for the community is in hundreds of thousands of dollars, in food fuel, and lodging. Having a well-planned and suitable staging area adds significant value to any of these hosted events.

Communities in western Nevada have begun to string together new, existing or potential OHV staging areas. Allowing for the rural community connectivity. With the increase in OHV visitors, it is important we provide a quality staging area. As new facilities are created around Nevada, we are able to highlight the "OHV Friendly Communities", of which Beatty all, & Nye County already identify, and those communities can direct tourists to a safe well managed location to park and ride from.

Amended Patent Plan of Development Approved

Reference is made to recreation and public purpose patent (27-71-0018) to Nye County Board of County Commissioners on August 17, 1970.

By email dated July 18, 2024, Beatty General Improvement District requested an amendment to their plan of development. The proposed changes in use and development have been reviewed and recommendation for approval has been made.

Therefore, pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned, the amended plan of development for recreation and public purposes patent (27-71-0018) is amended to include a OHV staging area and other recreation facilities (submitted on July 18, 2024). All terms and conditions of the patent continue to apply.

This decision may be appealed to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of the Secretary, in accordance with the regulations contained in 43 CFR, Part 4 and the enclosed 1842-1 form. If an appeal is taken, your notice of appeal must be filed in this office (at the above address) within 30 days from receipt of this decision. The appellant has the burden of showing that the decision appealed from is in error.

If you wish to file a petition (request) pursuant to regulation 43 CFR 2801.10 or 2881.10 for a stay (suspension) of the effectiveness of this decision during the time that your appeal is being reviewed by the Board, the petition for a stay must accompany your notice of appeal. A petition

for a stay is required to show sufficient justification based on the standards listed below. Copies of the notice of appeal and petition for a stay must also be submitted to each party named in this decision and to the Interior Board of Land Appeals and to the appropriate Office of the Solicitor (see 43 CFR 4.413) at the same time the original documents are filed with this office. If you request a stay, you have the burden of proof to demonstrate that a stay should be granted.

Standards for Obtaining a Stay

Except as otherwise provided by law or other pertinent regulation, a petition for a stay of a decision pending appeal shall show sufficient justification based on the following standards:

- (1) The relative harm to the parties if the stay is granted or denied,
- (2) The likelihood of the appellant's success on the merits,
- (3) The likelihood of immediate and irreparable harm if the stay is not granted, and
- (4) Whether the public interest favors granting the stay.
