SECTION V – PRIORITIES AND SCORING NARRATIVE

1. Law Enforcement Strategy that addresses registration enforcement, including Public Education & Outreach aimed at increasing renewals and new registrations:

With the addition of this trail head State Park Law Enforcement will be able to monitor OHV use in the park and surrounding areas better and have a more central point of contact with users. Law Enforcement staff will be able to meet people while they are unloading, preform registration and safety equipment checks utilizing the law enforcement reporting form. This strategy will allow us to have a better impact on educating the users of what is required of them and the importance of registering their OHV's. We plan on placing signs with OHV rules and regulations including information on how to register OHV's and the importance of doing so.

2. Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities:

This project will be a huge enhancement to the 11 plus miles of trails we have within Beaver Dam State Park along with the miles of OHV friendly county-maintained roads outside the park. Nevada State Parks staff is fully committed to maintaining these trails and the new trail head. Currently Park staff spends at least one week every spring and fall maintaining the trails we have. Park staff does its best to patrol the trails at least once a week and remove any hazards that are there and document future work that will be needed. We also plan to work with OHV groups and have trail clean up days that will help maintain the trails better.

3. Training:

Our current goals are to start an OHV safety training program here in Lincoln County. We would like to have park staffed trained through a nationally recognized program so that we can preform classes in various locations throughout our county.

4. Trail mapping and signing of existing trails and facilities:

Trail signage is a major part of our grant. We hope to install three trail maps throughout the park. Currently we have no map signs for our OHV trails. We have recently had our GIS specialist out mapping trails and will get all that information out to the OHV program as soon as it becomes available. These maps are also going to be included on a new app that Nevada State Parks will be putting out soon.

5. Connectivity/Loops:

This trail head will be located on State Park property adjacent to a county road that is listed under Lincoln County OHV trails on the ohv.nv.gov/trails page. This will make a great location to not only explore our trails but those trails as well. We plan on making a trail map that will show the users how to get from Beaver Dam State Park to the Historic Elgin School House on OHV friendly trails and in the future hope to link them to Cathedral Gorge and Echo Canyon State parks as well.

6. Planning, Environmental Studies, Conservation:

This project will help to enhance what we have been working on already which is to give OHV users a place to ride within our parks to avoid people trespassing and riding in areas where sensitive cultural and natural resources can be damaged. Part of this grant will include four interpretive signs that will document the resources near by that we are tasked with protecting.

7. Access:

With the addition of this trail head and signs OHV users will have easier access to the trails in our park. The trailhead will also have direct access to the Lincoln County OHV Trails on your webpage linking our park to areas such as Barclay, Mesquite, and Enterprise Utah. This will be the first trail head in this area that is used by OHV riders from all of the surrounding areas.

8. Partnering and Leverage:

Beaver Dam State Park has the full support of the Nevada State Parks who has graciously provided us with funding to help make our park more OHV friendly. We also work very closely with the Lincoln County Commission on Tourism who provide us with advertising assistance and financial help with marketing our trails and parks. We have in the past worked with groups such as the Kokopelli ATV Club out of Mesquite.

9. Economic Integration:

Outdoor recreation is one of the leading economic sources for all of Lincoln County. Nevada State Parks is committed to being at the for front of continuing to help grow the economic impact that this provides our rural county. This trail head will be the first one on the eastern side of Lincoln County near the Utah state Line. Providing access to OHV users from that area to Lincoln County helping to showcase what we have to offer them and hopefully encouraging them to plan more trips to this part of the state.

10. Demand for New Facilities:

Currently there are no other OHV Trail Heads in Lincoln County that connect Nevada State Parks OHV trails to federally managed land or OHV friendly county-maintained roads. This trail head will hopefully be just the beginning of trail heads and projects that link state, federal, and county roads that the OHV community can enjoy.
