Please explain how you intend to manage user interactions:

During calendar year 2021, the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety will use the funds requested in a partnership with the Nevada Off-Highway Vehicle Commission to create a Safe Trails Initiative. The initiative will be focused on OHV enforcement and education on trails and OHV areas owned leased or under the control of the City of Las Vegas as well as overall trail safety. Furthermore, CLVDPS will continue to partner with allied agencies within Clark County and provide OHV education, training and information.

The requested six BMW Enduro motorcycles will be used for enforcement, training and education. They will be used to engage with the public on the trails, while hosting educational classes, as well as while conducting compliance checks and enforcement activities on the various trails within the City of Las Vegas and connecting/surrounding areas.

The City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety will purchase six patrol-ready Enduro motorcycles to actively patrol for trail safety and OHV registration compliance primarily on the 239+ miles of various trails within City limits. These trails include; transportation trails, pedestrian paths, multi-use trails, bicycle trails, equestrian trails and recreation trails. In addition to the various trails the City of Las Vegas is responsible for patrolling flood control channels and basins. All of these areas are frequented by OHV users in the City illegally for recreation and as a means to get to approved areas and BLM lands. Often these OHV operators travel through neighborhoods and parks which require our officer's response. Additionally, the department will provide OHV compliance training to all of its patrol officers so that any officer who comes into contact with an OHV in any city park or on the streets will be fully educated in registration compliance. 14. - **1. Law Enforcement-** Describe your strategy that addresses registration enforcement, including Public Education & Outreach aimed at increasing OHV safety. Include past quantitative data for OHV Citations issued, safety courses, and registration events.

The City of Las Vegas (CLV) Department of Public Safety's (DPS) project plan is to use the funding to purchase (6) Enduro replacement motorcycles/protective gear to assist in the registration enforcement efforts of all Off-Highway Vehicles operating within the city limits and to assist in the protection and safety of the trails and off highway areas primarily within the City of Las Vegas and surrounding area. Additionally, the department sponsored community oriented policing (COP) education events will provide opportunities to communicate information on OHV safety, registration, and compliance at the appropriate level to the appropriate age groups.

In 2014, due to the significant expansion of the city of Las Vegas Trail network, our department identified the need to more effectively patrol certain areas of the city; specifically to be able to provide enhanced law enforcement protection primarily in the areas inaccessible to traditional patrol units such as on our facility parking lots, trails, trailheads, plazas, retention basins, and in City parks. Research began, purchases were made, training was conducted, and in March of 2016 the DPS motor patrol program was a pilot program starting with four units and six officers. Over the course of the five years, a lot of experience has been gained, fuel has been saved (motorcycle 42MPG vs patrol car 14MPG), and hundreds of arrests each year have been made. The motorcycles average 90 miles per day seven days a week 5am to 3pm and routinely attend Community Oriented Policing events for the public. Since the inception of the program, the pilot program has become a part of the Deputy City Marshals and grown to twelve certified officers and six motorcycles. This request if funded will enable the unit to grow by four units and move two older units to be utilized in the officer training/certification program.

The City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety does not currently have past data to support the OHV initiatives and efforts but will willingly agree to going-forward incorporating these activities into regular enforcement (warnings, citations, and education) and Community-Oriented Policing educational events and establish a tracking mechanism to be able to report number of officers trained, number of warnings/citations issued, number of community events attended and number of community members reached for at least the duration of the grant reporting.

2. Planning, Environmental Studies, Conservation - Describe how project planning and environmental studies will mitigate resources impacted by OHV recreation. How will the project contribute to conservation of our Natural Resources?

Planning, Environmental Studies, and conservation are not directly part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan. However, by conducting safety and registration educational/professional outreach and enforcement efforts, our project will contribute to conservation of our natural resources.

4. Enhancement or Maintenance Existing Trails and Facilities - Describe the maintenance intervals for your project. How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will the project site host a cleanup or maintenance day? How will your project be maintained and who has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or trail? *A minimum of 2 maintenance events are required per year*

Enhancement and Maintenance of existing trails and facilities are not directly part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan. However, the City of Las Vegas maintains its trails utilizing our Rapid Response team which is responsible for graffiti abatement, trail maintenance and homeless encampment cleanups. CLV DPS currently patrols full-time seven days a week from 5am to 3pm in areas which include Floyd Lamb Park, Cliff Shadows open Desert Park, Cliff Shadows Trails and numerous other areas where off-highway vehicles operate.

In reference to the OHV education component, it is our intention to work with the CLV Information Technologies department to create a QR code. QR codes can be read by any smart phone and can be useful to convey information directly on the trails when encountering OHV users. The CLV QR code will link to off-highway education and OHV registration information. Patrolling and providing education increase safety and compliance in areas where off-highway vehicles ride, play and visit.

- 5. Connectivity/loops How does this project increase connectivity between trail centers, facilities, and local amenities? Does your project link to other OHV projects?

 Connectivity/loops are not directly part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan; however, the City of Las Vegas trail network runs throughout the Las Vegas valley crisscrossing and connecting many jurisdictions within Clark County, North Las Vegas, Henderson and Boulder City and patrolling and providing education at these connectivity points is part of our plan.
- 6. Access Describe how your project protects or Improves OHV access to recreation areas.

 How will access be restricted if this project does not occur?

 Protecting or improving OHV access is not part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan. However keeping the areas and users safe through routinely patrolling and enforcement efforts ensures safe access to recreation areas for riding, playing, and visiting.

 Trail mapping is not part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan.


 However, the DPS Marshals recommend new trails to the system and provide trail updates as

Partnerships with North Las Vegas and the Clark County School Police have been established providing training for their motorcycle patrols at the direct expense of the City of Las Vegas. Additionally, the City of Las Vegas is proposing to provide matching funds to cover 100% of the salary and benefits of the officers trained to provide motorcycle law enforcement activities on the off highway trails and to provide educational safety outreach at our Community-Oriented Policing events as part of the City of Las Vegas Department of Public Safety's project plan. The City of North Las Vegas provided a letter of appreciation for our continued partnership and the training of their officers. See attachment.


- **9. Economic Integration** How does your project help local, regional, or state economies grow? What is the economic impact of your project?
