Type here Our department's Search and Rescue Team has also submitted a grant proposal requesting funding for a track vehicle. This vehicle will be extremely useful for life saving efforts and provide a needed tool for accessing stranded trail riders or skiers during the winter month in all areas of the Douglas County and beyond. Mutual Aid requests during the height of the winter months in common place and we hope to be able to partner and provide assistance when called upon.

Type here For the coming grant period, DCSO staff has already engaged with partnerships to include Douglas County Disposal in NV (who have offered to provide large dumpsters at least twice a year for illegal dumping clean efforts) The Ahern Company in Gardnerville NV to provide a trailer and backhoe services to assist with the illegal dumping clean ups (since oftentimes the items dumped are abandoned or burnt vehicles and other large items), as well as the Sierra Stompers 4x4 club and Pine Nut Mountain Trail Riders Association to also commit volunteers in this effort.

We also became more aware of the illegal dumping problems we recognize need additional attention for the coming year. We also plan to shift from a "warning" of not having proper OHV stickers to an enforcement effort moving forward. We now also have a newly promoted and enthusiastic Sergeant in charge of this project who has already stimulated more interest in these grant project areas.
		DCSO would also like to advocate for the expanded use of our Search and Rescue Team during the winter months when our 4x4 lack the ability to access many snow covered areas. They have applied as a secondary entity in hopes of obtaining a tracked ATV for such purposes.
