Proposed Scope of Work

Once yearly for two consecutive years the Dunes and Trails UTV Club will conduct a desert clean up at the Nelson Hills Nevada trail system consisting of at least 12 club member volunteers. There is excessive dumping in several areas at Nelson that would benefit from debris and trash removal. Due to volume and distance, we are requesting funds for mechanical loaders (skid steers), dump trailers, tools, safety equipment, and a 40-yard dumpster.

A letter of support from the BLM approving the proposed clean-up is included with this submission. Dumpsters will be rented from Boulder City Landfill, skid steers from United rental, dump trailers and tools from Home Depot and safety supplies purchased from Amazon.

Separately, once yearly for two consecutive years, the Dunes and Trails ATV Club will host an OHV Safety Fair and OHV Registration Drive. The fair will highlight Ride Safe, Ride Smart information and training from the Nevada Outdoor School, "stop the bleed" information, and proper helmet use education. Other organizations such as SNORR (Southern Nevada Off Road Recovery) and Las Vegas Metro's OHV unit will be invited to participate. The goal of the OHV Registration Drive is to increase new registrations year over year. Hosting a safety fair with a registration drive will aim to attract more users and increase awareness of the importance of registering annually.

If funded, D&T will offer participation to other partners such as Tread Lightly! and Nevadans for Cultural Preservation, thus widening the educational impact.

Shade structures will be provided along with tables and chairs, and a large banner with OHV Commission provided verbiage. The safety supplies will include a small first aid kit, gauze bandage kit and a tourniquet. Stop the Bleed will be provided with chairs in an area for group instruction.

Project Deliverables

The Nelson Clean up would remove a substantial volume of trash, estimated at 4,000 pounds. A picture of existing debris conditions is included in the supporting documents.

The Safety Fair/Registration Drive would target the OHV community and provide them with safety information from our partners as well as providing free safety related supplies including tourniquets, first aid packs, etc. registration services such as vin inspections and providing assistance with completing the appropriate forms.

The Safety Fair/Registration Drive outreach will be held at OHV related businesses with ample parking and space for vin inspections and with safety demonstration/training space.

Engagement will be tracked via sign in sheets for volunteers and participants. D&T will use our Facebook page to advertise the event, the business we partner with would be expected to use their existing marketing tools to support and advertise the event as well.

These clean up events showcase the care and concern of land use by OHV users. Volunteer group pictures along with the OHV commission banner will be posted on Facebook and provided to local media. By highlighting the misuse by others, we look to promote awareness by all users, hoping to reduce the future illegal dumping. The Outreach Safety fair will include an OHV registration drive and information. Additionally, the Henderson Fire and Las Vegas Metro OHV units will be invited to participate.

Any clean up runs the risk of coming across harmful materials, should we encounter any such items we will ensure they are disposed of properly at the appropriate disposal location. This will minimize the potential for wildlife or trail users encountering these substances.

Included in our goal of educating the public in locations of heavy use is to garner public support for the improvement and management of the staging areas once the appropriate federal plans are in place opening the door for future improvements. The long-term intent is to generate enthusiasm and interest among the Dunes and Trails club and the surrounding community for ongoing yearly clean up events, with the potential to grow participation to include other off-road related organizations.

All labor are volunteers and provided in-kind for matching funds. The project estimations are based on a minimal volunteer turn-out. It is expected that as these clean up events will continue and a formal published schedule will be created and participation will continue to expand beyond just club members. D&T will continue to seek assistance in its clean-ups from private and local government entities.

OHV recreation adds millions of dollars to the Nevada economy every year, we support maintaining and growing that revenue source as well as increasing OHV registration awareness by highlighting the support and funding received from the OHV Commission.


The proposed project is consistent with land use allocations described in the Las Vegas Resource Management Plan (1998) and in compliance with applicable, federal, state, and local laws and regulations. The project will be reviewed for potential environmental impacts and if necessary, BLM will carry out the required documents in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).


