

Popularity of off-highway vehicles (OHVs) has surged in Nye County over the last several years. As the recreational use of off-highway vehicles has increased, so has the frequency of violations and accidents incurring both property damage and injury. In several cases these injury accidents have produced fatalities, reports of property damage and environmental concerns. The concerns are mostly dust hazards associated with OHV activity and have in themselves cause collateral damage accidents by limiting the visibility of on road drivers. Additionally, OHV theft has increased and the identifying of ownership in recovered OHV has become increasingly difficult due to non-registration.

Nye County has six major areas that are considered open areas for OHV riders by the BLM; each have heavy attendance throughout the year.

- Amargosa Flats Dry Lake
- Big Dune
- Crystal Dry Lake
- Stewart Dry Lake
- Spring Mountain Range
- Beatty OHV Trails

These areas are open areas and require the OHV riders to be much more cognizant of impacts caused by OHV use and drive in a safe and responsible manner.

In addition, there are several off-road events conducted over Nye County roads and trails each year a few of these are The Best in the West, Beatty Off Road Poker Run, and the Mountain Bike Runs. Beatty Nevada located in central Nye County is actively soliciting off road events in an attempt to increase their tourist trade. Throughout Nye County citizens and visitors take their families and friends on remote rides via all types of off road vehicles, horses, mules, or travel by foot into the uninhabited areas in Nye County on vacation, hunting expeditions, during the weekend or their time off.

The popularity of off-highway vehicles (OHVs) has always been high in Nye County, however popularity surged in Nye County over the last several years and a majority of these vehicles are not registered and are ridden by young adults and children sixteen years and younger. OHVs are used in Nye County towns, surrounding areas and going to and from trail heads. As the recreational use of off-highway vehicles has 2021 Nevada OHV Grant Application

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increased both within and outside our communities, so has the frequency of violators, accidents (some fatal) and reports of property damage and environmental concerns (dust hazards) associated with OHV activity.

Nye County is the third largest county in the United States, and Nye County Sheriff's Office serves a population of approximately 46,000 residents and hosts thousands of additional visitors each year and is responsible for providing law enforcement services to approximately eighteen thousand (18,000) square miles.

Nye County encompasses an area larger than ten (10) of our fifty (50) states combined.

The Bureau of Land Management in Nevada has listed eight (8) of the most popular routes and areas.

The fourth on the list is the Big Dune Special Recreation Management Area which runs through the heart of Nye County. As a result of this well advertised popular route, and the numerous other less popular OHV trails, OHV operation in Nye County is a regular occurrence.

The Pahrump Regional Planning Commission and Public Lands Advisory Committee have supported the increase use of OHV in Nye County for years. In 2014 they sponsored legislation regarding road sharing legislation for OHVs which continues to bring new OHVs to Nye County.

Nye County OHV trails and trail riders often cross over from Nye County to Clark County Nevada,

Esmeralda County Nevada and into Inyo County in California. As a result, the OHV trails traverse the vast
terrain of Nye County and sprawl into adjacent Counties, accidents and incidents often occur somewhere in the
mountains where travel is often limited to off highway vehicles only. Thanks to the OHV Grant 2016 the
agency fleet now includes an OHV in each area command of the County to assist in accident or incident scene
as well as search and rescue operations.

The OHV Grant 2018 funded the NCSO OHV Education Awareness program and we saw great success. This program was intended to promote awareness for registration of OHV and ensure that OHVs are being operated in compliance with the NRS. Prior to the Education Awareness Program many Nye County OHV owners still had not registered their OHV. After the Education Awareness Program Nye County saw a significant increase in registered OHV's.

Nye County received thousands of views on social media campaign with the 2018 Education Awareness Program. We held numerous registration campaigns and during the events we had a steady stream of citizens registering their OHVs. This was a largely successful event and was very effective.

This project request is to revitalize the Education Awareness Program to continue to encourage OHV owners to register their vehicles.

This project will consist of several public efforts to ensure Nye County residents have an increased awareness regarding registration of OHVs.

We will revitalize our OHV website which received significant traffic during the time period funded by the 2018 OHV Grant.

 Nye County Sheriff's Office will create a domain similar to www.ncsoohv.com link on their website where OHV owners can receive OHV registration information. In addition, this site will provide connection to State of Nevada OHV resources.

We will begin running OHV social media ads educating the public regarding OHV laws.

 Nye County Sheriff's Office will run a Facebook ad that will appear throughout the grant period to all Facebook users in Nye County educating OHV owners about laws relating to registration of OHVs.

We will begin running television ads educating the public regarding OHV laws.

• Nye County Sheriff's Office will run a television ad nightly during the weekday 5:00 p.m. news dedicated to awareness about OHV registration on Nye County's television station which is simulcast on the radio station as well.

We will begin running newspaper ads educating the public regarding OHV laws.

 Nye County Sheriff's Office will run an ad in the two local newspapers dedicated to raising awareness for OHV registration. The ad will be published weekly.


We will have OHV Registration Events throughout Nye County

- Nye County Sheriff's Office will host two registration events in each of the following areas during this grant period. These events will be held in Southern Area, Central Area and Northern Area. These events will allow people to bring their OHV to the event location to have it inspected and complete the registration paperwork at that event. The Nye County Sheriff's Office will have staff there to assist in the registration process.
- In addition, Deputies will be given the registration marketing handout materials (spinner/lanyards) to hand out during interactions with individuals on OHV. These materials will drive OHV operators to our website, and our education awareness information.

This grant will allow the Nye County Sheriff's Office to revitalize the program that we ran using the 2018 OHV Grant. We saw such great success with the 2018 Education Awareness campaign, we are hopeful that this grant funding will allow our agency to once again make a huge education push to the community and help OHV operators be compliant with the law and get their OHVs registered.


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
