The Chamber will be teaming up with local law enforcement, land management, local OHV based businesses, and OHV organizations to create a list of safety rules and regulations for OHV and personal outdoor safety that will be printed in the booklet and on the Chamber website for easy access from visitors. These will be explained through images, examples, and additional references for easy access and understanding.

This will include OHV Laws in Mesquite sited in the Mesquite NV Code of Ordinances 6.7 regarding Off highway Vehicle Use and Operation, as well as, the local OHV friendly street map. These will be posted both in the booklet and the Chamber website. We also plan on including the OHV Streets KMZ file on the Chamber website for easy download for OHV users. This project will encourage OHV training to keep individuals safe, keep our natural resources safe, and keep individuals informed on OHV regulations and laws. We do not currently have a new mapping component to this project (we are working with local organizations to use existing maps), however, if new mapping became part of this project, we would gladly take steps to share it with OHV.NV.GOV to keep information, trails, etc. as up-to-date as possible.

The City of Mesquite is currently working on a project to properly mark trails. The Chamber plans on showing clearly marked trail heads in our booklet with the help of other local organizations, land management, and local outdoor groups and OHV clubs. We will also be encouraging the use of the proper facilities.

This project will utilize information regarding OHV use and safety in Mesquite, NV. Additionally, it will also include information on local wildlife, and rules and regulations regarding marked trails. Our goal is to keep riders on the correct trails to

minimize the negative impact OHV riding could have on wildlife while conserving our natural resources.

This project will encourage OHV use to marked and safe OHV trails that will directly improve individual safety. This project will go over OHV safety, and OHV laws. Riders that do not receive this information from this booklet will need to find sources and resources in a different way, whereas this project will have information and links all in one area for convenience to riders, the city, OHV businesses, clubs, and land management organizations.
