Please explain how you intend to manage user interactions:

The primary mission of MotoMedX is to provide on-site medical, safety and training services to the OHV community in both recreation and competitive settings. As a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, pending IRS approval, MotoMedX will be providing services utilizing volunteer labor. These services will include trained medical personnel equipped with transportable medical equipment, providing assistance during OHV activities in remote areas inaccessible to traditional EMS modalities. These personnel will accompany OHV users during club/organized group rides, trail building and maintenance projects, and competitive OHV events. Direct fees for the services will not be required from the entity requesting MotoMedX services, though a recommended, non-compulsory donation will be encouraged.

As an enhancement to the primary mission of on-site OHV medical services, and working in cooperation with like-minded entities such as the Reno Fire Department and the Kurt Caselli Foundation, MotoMedX will also offer four (4) quarterly training classes for OHV users on the topic of first aid and CPR in the OHV environment, when on-site medical services have not yet arrived on scene or have not been requested for an event.

Continuing with the concept of preventive training, MotoMedX will facilitate classes in the proper use and maintenance of powered equipment often used in trail building and maintenance. As an example, certified or "red-carded" fellers will provide training to OHV clubs and organizations detailing the proper use and maintenance of chainsaws and similar equipment in either classroom type or onsite settings to promote user safety and land stewardship during trail building/maintenance events.

Lastly, as an extension to its mission of safety and training MotoMedX plans to offer classes on health and fitness specifically tailored to OHV activities, to enhance and support the overall experience of the OHV participant.

The current focus of services will be primarily for events catering to off-highway motorcycle users, with anticipated expansion for OHV quad and UTV Side by Side events in the near future. As such, the promotion of compliance with all OHV registration and similar requirements will be repeatedly stressed throughout all MotoMedX operations.

 - 1) Providing trained EMS personnel and equipment for OHV events throughout Northern Nevada, i.e. organized trail rides, trail clean-ups, trail building and maintenance, competitive OHV events, etc. Services will be provided on-site at each event requesting services.
 - 2) Four (4) quarterly one-day training sessions for OHV recreational users in basic emergency medical skills to stabilize injuries typical to OHV usage. Sessions will be held at locations in the greater Reno/Sparks area, but open to attendees throughout the region. Attendance will be limited to twenty (20) attendees.
 - 3) Training in proper use, care and maintenance of equipment used during OHV trail maintenance, i.e. power tool transport, usage and maintenance, basic related OHV maintenance, etc. Training will be held on an as-requested basis, either onsite of the specific event, or prior to at a venue in the greater Reno/Sparks area.
 - 4) Providing certified training in various areas of health and fitness specific to OHV operation with emphasis on injury prevention. Training will be held either on-site of the specific event, or prior to at a venue in the greater Reno/Sparks area.

Though Law Enforcement is not a primary facet of our mission statement, MotoMedX recognizes proper and judicious trail stewardship is a bulwark of the OHV community of which we are a part. Furthermore, as a potential adjunct to public safety entities, cooperative efforts with Law Enforcement Agencies will undoubtedly be required in the event of a rescue incident. Without support of the programs which make our passion possible, the ultimate result will undoubtedly be unfavorable for us all. As such, all of the programs presented and supported by MotoMedX will vehemently promote the requirements of the OHV Commission registration guidelines and regulations.

2. Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities: Describe the maintenance intervals for your project. How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will your project hold a maintenance/trails enhancement event? As MotoMedX will facilitate training in the proper use and maintenance of equipment used for trail enhancement and maintenance, as well as providing on-site safety and medical for these types of events, we will be operating cooperatively with those organizations requesting our services throughout the year based on their schedules. As such, it is difficult to provide a definitive timeline as to the number of events MotoMedX will be participating in. However, it is safe to predict that we will be involved multiple times of the year, and likely on a monthly basis, in the various trail building, trail maintenance and clean-up projects, and group rides common to the Northern Nevada OHV community.

3. Training: Please describe the goals and objectives of your public training program, i.e., Public Education, Rider Classes, Safety, Trail Building, or Outdoor Ethics. Number of people trained, contacts made, etc.

The genesis of MotoMedX began in mid 2019, when its founder and President, Steve Clark, a 26-year veteran of the Reno Fire Department, realized there was a profound gap in the emergency medical response for the OHV community in Northern Nevada. Countless times a year, OHV riders are injured in remote areas which are either difficult or impossible to access by traditional EMS modalities. Protracted responses by public safety entities often take hours to respond to the scene of a downed rider, which in some circumstances, can have tragic results. This fact is as true for the individual dirt biker on a single track as it is for the organized group rides or competitions that take place at any given time throughout Northern Nevada. With the exponential increase in OHV users, this issue is growing with proportional intensity. Mitigating this burgeoning problem is the impetus behind MotoMedX.

The primary mission of MotoMedX is to provide seasoned OHV riders with EMS training who are on site of OHV events to provide the immediate care traditional EMS cannot due to access. These riders are equipped with medical gear to handle typical traumas common to OHV accidents. Additionally, riders are outfitted with communications equipment in order to contact traditional EMS providers and arrange swift and efficient extraction of a downed rider when necessary. These on-site services are available to recognized OHV organizations, recreational and competitive, operating on state, federal and private lands. MotoMedX currently projects at least a monthly involvement in these types of events for the foreseeable future.

To further enhance its primary goal of medical services, MotoMedX will have a secondary focus on training for both prevention of injury and an extension of its own EMS services by way of a rider first-aid training program. Using American Red Cross First Aid and American Heart Association CPR training systems, or similarly recognized standards, MotoMedX will offer four (4) classes annually, on a quarterly basis for OHV riders seeking to add specific emergency health care knowledge to their repertoire. MotoMedX will be seeking to partner with the Kurt Caselli Foundation, in this endeavor through the promotion of their Rider 1st Responder program. As the Kurt Caselli Foundation has already donated a cache of communications equipment to MotoMedX via PCI Race Radios, a relationship between the two organizations already exists and will likely yield an invaluable benefit to the OHV community.

Continuing with its theme of training in the promotion of OHV user safety, MotoMedX will partner with organizations such as the Reno Area Dirt Riders during their trail maintenance, building and clean-up events. Due to its origins in public safety,

MotoMedX has access to professionals certified in the use of equipment commonly used in trail building and maintenance such as chainsaws. Either on-site or prior to a trail project, MotoMedX will provide training on the proper transport, use and care of this equipment, emphasizing personal safety, operation and environmental impact. As is its primary mission, MotoMedX will provide on-site medical in the event of a mishap, during the actual trail-related events.

Lastly, MotoMedX recognizes OHV use can be a physically challenging undertaking, especially for single track riders. Oftentimes, disaster can be avoided with some physical preparation prior to the activity. As such, MotoMedX will be offering activity-specific certified health and fitness training for OHV organizations wishing to avail themselves of these services. As the old adage says, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure."

Most of the events in which MotoMedX operates will be at existing OHV locations, though a substantial part of the training operations will also take place at venues within the local community. During training, regardless of the setting, trail maps and specific site locations will be a part of the information distributed to attendees. As such, proper access by transport vehicles as well as OHV equipment will be discussed as a function of training and stewardship of the environment.

6. Planning, Environmental Studies, Conservation: Describe how the environmental studies, conservation and/or planning will mitigate resources impacted by OHV recreation. How will your project contribute to the conservation of our natural resources?

As a regular component of the various training disciplines offered by MotoMedX, continual emphasis regarding best practices of land management will be echoed throughout. Preservation of the environment will be an integral component of all training topics, as well as adherence to OHV Commission rules and regulations.

As described previously, MotoMedX will continually echo the importance of judicious stewardship by all OHV users regardless of the situation or event in which they may find themselves.

Community leader involvement is very often a component to OHV events, especially in the realm of public safety and EMS. With its own origins in these communities, MotoMedX has many professional contacts and resources to draw from to positively affect both the OHV community and the community at large. As these relationships already exist, cooperative involvement and the success of MotoMedX in its mission is virtually a foregone conclusion.

With an entity such as MotoMedX operating as a vanguard for medical, safety and training within the OHV communities, the burden on traditional public safety is reduced, and by extension, the economic impact a protracted EMS or rescue operation can have on an already strained budget. With trained, professional personnel already on scene of an OHV incident, much of the logistical unknowns are mitigated for the responding agencies. This can only be a positive when it comes to local fiscal impact. Furthermore, with OHV organizations being proactive in their own medical, safety and training, rather than relying on public entities in a reactive role, the reputation of the OHV community at large can only be enhanced into the future.
