This project will increase collaborative efforts with the recreational community who have sought a better, less complicated recreation area specific to off-road vehicle use. This includes the local business owners, such as those represented by the Yerington Chamber of Commerce, who have expressed interest in utilizing the area for events and fundraisers.

## **14. SCOPE of WORK:**

This project is seeking funding to have a vault toilet constructed, a well drilled, and having a track builder assist with dirt work (to be completed in phases) at Farmy's Off Road Park. The City of Yerington acquired in a land trade with a mining company, as part of the 2012 Public Lands bill. Yerington was cited as an underserved community and at implementation suffered from the highest unemployment rate in the state of Nevada. In 2022 the Yerington City Council voted unanimously to designate this property for off-road use. Farmy Inc. was the nonprofit formed and assigned via an MOU to manage the area on behalf of the city.

The newly designated area serves several purposes, it provides a controlled environment for people new to off-roading, particularly children, to take safety classes. Additionally, the area will help ease the burden on other popular OHV areas that have suffered damage from overuse, reducing negative environmental impact, while allowing for remediation. Having a specific purpose for this property will also act as a deterrent to nefarious activity, as well as offering a welcoming center point for limitless outdoor recreation opportunities. Farmy's Off Road Park plans to offer a venue for outdoor recreation events, to increase tourist participation, which will offer a previously unattainable source of economic input for the City of Yerington and surrounding areas. The project is anticipated to take less than one year from funding to completion. However, the work will be completed in approximately three phases, so as not to have the entirety of the park closed at any given time, as stated in the MOU between The City of Yerington and Farmy Inc. Having multiple phases of project development will also afford Farmy Inc with various opportunities to seek small amounts of funding, as opposed to one lump sum.

All the initial steps to order materials and schedule contractors will be completed with in the first six months of being awarded grant funding. The remainder of the time, approximately an additional six months, will be used to oversee completion of those individual projects. Project completion will vary due to funding and weather conditions.

By providing a quality facility, Farmy Inc/Farmy's Off Road Park will allow for a professional grade off road park. This will reduce the risk of overuse and damage to other OHV areas, or require any management or maintance by the federal government. Farmy Inc. plans to utilize a civil engineering firm, of the City of Yerington's direction, to evaluate the area. This evaluation will include a 3D map of the property to ensure proper placement of facilities, water drainage, track development, access roads, and utilities.

**2. Trail mapping and signing of existing trails and facilities:** *If a mapping component is included in the grant, describe how it will be integrated with the current web mapping application found on OHV.NV.GOV* (NRS 490.069 2.(c).2)

Signs at Farmy's Off Road Park will be provided via Tread Lightly! in an effort to maintain consistancly and educational messaging throughout the state.

**3. Demand for New Facilities:** *Provide justification for NEW facility/program development: restrooms, trails, signs, and other amenities.* (NRS 490.069 2.(c) 3.4)

This project will increase collaborative efforts with the recreational community who have sought a better, less complicated recreation area specific to off-road vehicle use. This includes the local business owners, such as the Yerington Chamber of Commerce, who have expressed interest in utilizing the area for events and fundraisers. There is also a need for a profecissional level facility after the closing of Wild West Motorsports park in 2021. Northern Nevada has also seen the closure of the "sand pits" in Fernley, due to recent land development. Farmy's Off Road Park will also be one of the few managed open OHV areas, vs others in the area that are more restrictive. Additionally, water and bathrooms are among the first steps for a better experience as identified in the scope of work above, and project purpose cited above.

4. Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities: How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will your project hold a maintenance/trails enhancement event? HOW will your project be maintained and WHO has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or trail (note: a minimum of 2 maintenance/trail events are required per year). This grant submission is targeted to create a new offroad complex in Yerington. This will reduce the use of existing, over-used OHV areas. The area will be designed to be a destination for off-road vehicle recreation. This will reduce less safe riding, and be more environmentally damaging behaviors. Access to water at Farmy's Off Road Park will also provide for better visibility during use of the park and reduce ecological concerns and minimize any public nuisance or disruption for other residence and businesses in the area.

**5. Connectivity/Loops:** *How will the project impact connectivity of OHV trails, facilities, and local communities? Include maps of areas impacted by your project and describe those impacts.* (NRS 490.069 2.(c) 2,5,6)

This Project, Farmy's Off Road Park, has existing connection to BLM routes that are in existence, and is under consideration to be part of the Battleborn Trail, which will allow mapped routs to the south all the way to Pahrump, and north to Dayton/Virginia City. Battleborn Trail is currently being designed.

The area will be designed to be a destination for off-road vehicle recreation, while simultaneously welcoming all forms of outdoor recreation. Its direct impact includes all the activities stated above, and more. Providing a well- lit accessible area increases the willingness of outdoor recreationalists to be active for a longer time. The access to water will also provide for better visibility during use of the park and reduce ecological concerns and minimize any public nuisance or disruption for other residence and businesses in the area.

Farmy's Off Road Park plans to host education programs through Nevada Outdoor School. Farmy Inc remains open to any other interested parties needing a facility for training purposes.

Farmy Inc remains open and amicable to any safety or public education/awareness program being hosted at Farmy's Off Road Park. This would be an ideal location for the NV OHV program and law enforcement to host a registration event as part of our grand opening.

The City of Yerington as the owner of this property, has planned for the use to be specifically for motorized recreation. The City Council has voted to proceed with the project and has an MOU in place for Farmy Inc to oversee and manage the development on the city's behalf. In addition to the City of Yerington, the Chamber of Commerce has expressed intresed in an active partnership for muntual support. Farmy Inc also works closely with Nevada Offroad Association, Boys and Girls Club, Nevada Outdoor School, and Tread Lightly! on different aspects of this project.

## **10. Economic Integration:** *How will this project improve OHV recreation opportunities that help local, regional, or state economies grow?* (NRS 490.069 2.(c) 7, 5)

Every step taken to improve any recreation facility adds value to the local economy. Farmy's Off Road Park is a designated tourism/ recreation spot and is expected to be a significant outdoor recreation destination. The City of Yerington does not have the budget to facilitate this project, as the median household income is 73% of the national average. As we learned during the economic downturn in 2020-21, outdoor recreation flourished. This is one indicator of how the economy may struggle, yet outdoor recreation continues to sustain. Farmy's is specifically poised to provide that alternate source of steady economic input. Outdoor recreationalists will continue to provide structure to the community financially, just as Farmy's Off Road Park will provide structure to the off-road community. The applicant does not have a quantitative figure that can identify the number of jobs retained or created, by providing an exceptional recreational area for participants to use, it will benefit many surrounding businesses. Visitors will need places to stay, eat, get fuel, buy parts, etc. Farmy Inc. will use all local contractors at every possible step in the process of building infrastructure.

## Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets for the terms and understanding between the nonprofit organization- Farmy Inc. and the City of Yerington to manage the city's municipal lands also known as "Y-Hill" to promote responsible recreational, educational, and competitive off-road events.

#### Background

Y-Hill is a former mineral mine and landfill. Over the years it has seen substantial use from the motorized off-road community, recreational target shooting, and dumping of refuse. Valley Off Road Race Association (VORRA) and other off-road promoters have used the existing trails and roads for competitive events without negative impact to the area. It is believed that having an overt management presence will work to dissuade illegal dumping and encourage recreational shooters to clean up after use of the area or relocate to a more appropriate location.

#### Purpose

This MOU will provide structure to aid Farmy Inc. in the management and development of the Y-Hill project, as well as allocating grant funds appropriately.

Initial infrastructure development is the agreed upon priority. Accomplishing this will entail seeking grant funding from various sources including the NV OHV Commission. Upon receipt of grant funding, a civil Engineering firm of the city's choosing will be contracted to provide guidance on infrastructure, specifically pertaining to power and water. Access will not be restricted during the management and development; however, active work areas may be isolated during an event for safety considerations.

#### Reporting

Farmy Inc.'s Executive Director, Laura Hardesty-Butcher and/or President, Brian Butcher will provide quarterly reports to both the City of Yerington and the organization(s) funding the grants, such as the NV OHV Commission. In addition to that, the City of Yerington will be included and updated as necessary.

#### Funding

This MOU is not a commitment of funds. Grants will be applied to provide the funding for the Y-Hill project. These applications will include a grant from the NV OHV Commission.

#### Duration

This MOU is at-will and may be modified by mutual consent of authorized officials from the City of Yerington and Farmy Inc. This MOU is perpetual and shall become effective upon signature by the authorized officials from the City of Yerington and Farmy Inc. and will remain in effect until modified or terminated by any one of the partners by mutual consent. In the absence of mutual agreement either party may withdrawal with a minimum of six months' notice, or thirty days after any future published event. (Whichever is latest).

The City of Yerington is committed to maintaining the facility and will allow for motorized access to those facilities for 25 years or the normal life of the project, whichever is greater.

The City of Yerington holds interest in the subject land that is sufficient in scope and authority to allow Farmy Inc to complete the proposed project at Farmy's Off Road Park, operate and maintain the proposed project after its completion.

The project is located on private land and is in conformance with the appropriate land management permits, licenses, clearances, and Federal environmental analyses documentation necessary to comply with local, state and/or federal laws specifically, NRS 490.069.

The Nevada Offroad Association (NVORA) has reviewed the grant application for Farmy Inc Off-Road Park (FORP) and occupies a seat on Farmy Inc Board of Directors.

When the City of Yerington sought out these applicants of this grant to establish "Y-Hill" area as an off-road recreational park, now known as "Farmy's Off Road Park" it was a clear message that the local community embraces OHV use and is actively working to promote responsible recreation.

Where the synergy of this action really adds value is when one looks to the OHV managed areas that have closed or those that are on Nevada's Public Lands yet are not advancing in a timeline that shows much measurable improvement. Meanwhile, FORP in it's 1<sup>st</sup> quarter hosted a professional level Off Road Race, was even able to leverage those users in attendance to provide the labor for a stewardship day picking up the debris dumped during the 25+ years of unmanaged use. This is why other OHV events like the desert motorcycle racers have already started to reach out to FORP seeking a venue.

Additionally, NVORA sees this as another component to the planned "Battle Born Trail/Route" that is being identified from Pahrump, via Beatty, Gold Point, Goldfield, Tonopah, Hawthorne, Yerington Dayton and ending in Virginia City. Locations like FORP, where OHV riders can stage, areas that are welcoming to OHV, add another valuable link in that chain.

The motorized offroad recreation community adds more than \$120 million to the Nevada economy annually. Western Lyon County has been an "Over Loved" riding destination for quite a while, as this commission knows, with the restoration work being conducted in Wilson Canyon. FORP will help draw some of those visitors further into the county and reduce the impact to the areas we are currently working to restore.
