The removal of illegal waste promotes a positive public land use image in the eyes of the non-OHV user. It is common for complaints surrounding OHV use to include debris and trash in the recreational area. Regular cleaning of the area provides a positive image to help continue access for the OHV community.

PNMTA has received some assistance in personnel volunteering and dumping fees in the past from some federal agencies. This funding has always been on an ad hoc and is not in forecast budgets. Sierra Stompers (a local four-wheel drive club) has always been a big supporter and helper of past clean-ups, along with others Pine Nut groups.

PNMTA has members affiliated with the leadership cadre of the Douglas County JROTC, who have offered to participate in the clean-ups, as well as various social, church and neighborhood groups. We also have had interest from the Rites Of Passage group to include clean ups in their public service requirements.

Maintaining a clean recreational environment and having volunteer clean up days improves the image of a presence and well managed public lands. PNMTA has participated in Carson Valley Visitor Authority's tourism program to encourage others to use the public land in our community. PNMTA receives inquiries from outside groups regarding riding in the Pine Nut Mountains and is always willing to provide suggestions and ideas for riding in the area. Most recently, a ATV club from Ohio requested information and brought 17 side by sides to the explore and spend time in the area.

While not the direct focus of this initial application, local tribal lands abut the public use lands and illegal dumping also occurs in their lands. PNMTA would like to increase the clean up areas to include tribal lands and anticipate acquiring permission from the Washoe nation in the first half of 2018 to access their land for a clean-up.
14	Maintenance: although this OHV grant program requires maintenance of all facilities funded for 25 years or the normal life of the project, we would like you to please describe HOW your project will be maintained and WHO has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or continuation of the service/program. (Please also attach letter as described in Section VI).	This is a grant application for continuing maintenance of the land though the cleanup program.
	Additional justification or project history if you feel important and doesn't fit under a criterion listed above.	The PMNTA started their clean ups in 1998 in conjunction with Public Lands Day. Since then, PNMTA .has tried to hold at least one annual clean up since then. Recently, the club has been ramping up its efforts due to the increased presence of illicit dumping. It has also been noticed increased locations of target practice waste by products, including such items as vehicles, computers, tv's, propane tanks, paints containers, etc. It is the expectation and desire of the club that with a regular clean up schedule, the public perception of dumping in the desert becomes less and less socially acceptable. An approach similar to "the don't pollute campaigns in the 1970s. While not the silver bullet in ending illegal dumping, this is a forward leaning community driven effort that should slow the illegal dumping; and perhaps, over time, making the need for this program obsolete.
