& Outreach aimed at increasing renewals and new registrations: How will your project
increase the number of OHV registrations on the district. How will the equipment and time be

Tread Lightly! will increase the number of OHV registrations by coordinating with the OHV program to provide registration information to OHV users. The work included in the Program Manager's job description will include promoting safe and responsible motorized use. The T.R.E.A.D. Principles include messaging about obeying all local, state and federal laws. The Principles address several of the infractions on the OHV Enforcement Patrol Statistics Form including but not limited to: driving under the influence, maintaining control of your vehicle at all times, utilizing proper safety gear including seatbelts, helmets and eye protection, traveling at safe speeds, yielding, obtaining all necessary permits including OHV stickers and vehicle registration, outfitting vehicles with all required equipment including for street legal vehicles.

2. Enhancement or Maintenance of existing trails and facilities: How will maintenance needs be prioritized and how often will your project hold a maintenance/ trails enhancement event?

HOW will your project be maintained and WHO has committed to the ongoing maintenance of the facility or trail (note: a minimum of 2 maintenance/ trail events are required per year).

Part of Tread Lightly!'s mission is to promote responsible use through stewardship projects. The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will work with agency and enthusiast partners to identify areas of concern and coordinate restoration projects to address the issues. The Program Manager will also work with Tread Lightly! leadership to identify and engage private industry partners to contribute to the projects. Tread Lightly! projects may include but are not limited to: general maintenance of trails and trail facilities, litter removal, signage replacement, revegetation, etc. The Tread Lightly! organization plans to complete 100 projects during the 2022 season. The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will be responsible for arranging no less than 2 projects in the 2022 calendar year.

3. Training: Please describe the goals and objectives of your public safety training program. Is it a nationally recognized certification? What sets your safety training program apart from the others?

Tread Trainer Courses: The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will facilitate Master Tread Trainer and Tread Trainer courses as well as Tread Lightly! Awareness courses and Tread Lightly! Overviews. The Tread Trainer program is a national train-the-trainer program funded by the Federal Highway Administration's Recreational Trails Program and is the only training of its kind for motorized recreational activities.

Online ethics course for youth and adults: Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will promote the online courses available through the Tread Lightly! website to grow the number of educated recreation enthusiasts in order to minimize impacts and user-conflict.

Courses include:

- Tread Lightly! 101
- TL! Kids Youth Online Quiz animated
- TL! Kids Matching Game
- UTV Impact projected launch 2022

Trailhead outreach: The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will work with Agency Advisors to determine high-priority areas to offer educational information at trailheads

Event attendance and sponsorship: The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will liaise with event promoters and clubs to identify outreach and sponsorship opportunities and provide an on-site education center when available.

Tread Lightly! will secure ethics messaging sponsorships at 4 widely attended events. Ethics messaging sponsorships place educational messages regarding the responsible, sustainable use of OHVs in event programs, live PA announcements, event websites and in the hands of event participants. Possible events:

- The MINT 400
- Legacy Racing Association Baja Nevada
- Best in the Desert Vegas to Reno
- Southern Nevada Off Road Enthusiasts (SNORE) LightForce Midnight Special

Social Media campaign: The social media campaign will be conducted in the state of Nevada. Tread Lightly! will work with the BLM and US Forest Service to identify agency points-of-contact to advise the program (Agency Advisors). Agency Advisors will identify high-priority areas in need of messaging and Tread Lightly! staff will select the specific messages that should be implemented (e.g. RIDE ON, Respected Access is Open Access, Respect & Protect, etc.) in order to maintain message integrity and consistency across boundaries. The social media calendar will be developed by Tread Lightly! staff and posts may include links to local resources, learning opportunities and events when possible.

Social media posts will be implemented throughout the year. Quarterly contact with Agency Advisors will be made to assess if changes in messaging or areas of interest should be adjusted.

Educational Poster Program: Since 2012, Tread Lightly!'s successful *Education Poster Giving Program* has distributed posters which promote responsible recreation on America's lands and waterways to land management agencies and recreational communities.

The primary purpose of the program is to help increase good stewardship, ensure consistent messaging across agency boundaries, minimize environmental impacts and social

conflict by delivering messages of responsible behavior and providing easy to understand tips.

Since the program's launch, Tread Lightly! has distributed thousands of posters throughout the nation to organizational partners and members. The customizable posters are placed on information bulletin boards and kiosks at trailheads or in visitor centers. Primarily, posters are requested by federal and state agency personnel to educate users in their parks and forests. Additionally, recreation clubs and associations order and customize posters to provide education to their members. The Nevada poster program would run in concert with Tread Lightly!'s national poster program. Dates vary by year.

Dealer/Outfitter outreach and education: The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program Manager will perform outreach with OHV dealerships and rental/outfitters to provide materials and resources to educate their customers on safe, responsible and sustainable recreation practices. When possible, dealers and outfitters will be included in stewardship efforts including fundraising for projects.

Educational Materials Dissemination: Tread Lightly! will produce and supply educational materials to district offices, enthusiast clubs and local retailers/outfitters. The educational materials will promote the safe, responsible and sustainable use of OHV's on public lands. Tread Lightly! will engage its members and clubs to identify local events in need of responsible recreation messaging.

Office of Tourism: Building on similar, existing programs in surrounding states, Tread Lightly! will contact the Nevada Office of Tourism to develop a multimedia campaign that educates the public about recreation opportunities, incorporating messages that emphasize safe, responsible, sustainable use.

4. Trail mapping and signing of existing trails and facilities: If a mapping component is included in the grant, please describe how it will be integrated with the current web mapping application found on OHV.NV.GOV

Tread Lightly! will collaborate with state and federal agency partners as well as local enthusiast groups, including "friends of" groups and industry contacts to plan, develop and install signage across the state of Nevada with consistent messaging that addresses responsible, ethical, sustainable use of the trails. Messages will be based on the Tread Lightly! T.R.E.A.D. Principles: Travel Responsibly, Respect the Rights of Others, Educate Yourself, Avoid Sensitive Areas and Do Your Part. The signage project would be completed in stages with the first stage identifying existing signage (where necessary assessments have already been performed) where content needs to be updated and signs or kiosks replaced or repaired. Future stages would include identifying areas in need of new signage and kiosks and would include any required assessments. Signage design will be determined on a case-by-case basis to meet the needs of each unique area but may include the following

elements: maps, boundaries, fire messaging, sensitive areas, points of interest, habitat and wildlife information and other details identified by stakeholders. Examples of recent signage projects are attached to this application.

 Connectivity/Loops: How will the project impact connectivity of OHV trails, facilities, and local communities? Please include maps of areas impacted by your project and describe those impacts.

This project will not directly impact the connectivity of OHV trails, facilities and local communities however each of these would benefit from the Tread Lightly! project through increased education and facilities improvements.

6. Planning, Environmental Studies, Conservation: Describe how the environmental studies, conservation and/or planning will mitigate resources impacted by OHV recreation. How will your project contribute to the conservation of our natural resources, while enhancing OHV opportunities?

Tread Lightly! is a national nonprofit dedicated to promoting responsible outdoor recreation through ethics education and stewardship projects in order to reduce conflict and minimize environmental impacts by improving the behavior of all outdoor recreation enthusiasts. Tread Lightly! delivers and implements educational outreach, materials and programs with strategies, priorities and objectives outlined through a collaborative process with program partners in order to conserve our natural resources and enhance OHV opportunities.

Started by the US Forest Service in 1985 specifically to address the impacts of motorized travel on America's public lands, Tread Lightly! has become the motorized ethic utilized by the Federal land management agencies through a non-expiring Memorandum of Understanding.

Incorporating the Tread Lightly! message into Nevada's OHV program will contribute to the conservation of Nevada's natural resources by providing consistent ethics education messaging and opportunities for enthusiasts to participate in stewardship projects. Informed recreationists are more likely to mitigate their impacts and improve their behavior in order to protect access to recreational areas.

Tread Lightly! works with a variety of stakeholders across the nation to foster stewardship and responsible use as a key component of recreation. We are uniquely positioned to bring government, industry and the public together to cooperate on public lands projects – leveraging existing relationships to provide the greatest return on investment.

7. Access: Please describe how your project improves OHV access in the project area. Explain what access/opportunities would be lost or restricted if the project does not occur.

Tread Lightly!'s messaging is an integral component of preserving access to OHV recreationists. Education and outreach are necessary in order to provide information to enthusiasts that empowers

them to make good decisions which result in positive outcomes. Without clear, consistent ethics messaging or resources, enthusiasts are more likely to cause unintentional damage to natural areas out of ignorance which often times leads to closures.

8. Partnering and Leverage: Who else is involved in this project? Please describe outreach with stakeholders, partners and local governments, that you have communicated with in planning this project.

Tread Lightly! has several industry partners interested in providing financial assistance to restoration and educational programming in the state of Nevada. Specifics must be withheld at this time due to limiting factors such as non-disclosure agreements. Tread Lightly! currently has a Supplemental Project Agreement with the USFS Forest Service which allows us to perform limited work throughout Region 4 which includes Nevada. If the project is approved, outreach to additional partners including agency and industry will begin specifically for a Nevada program including seeking additional funding from the Bureau of Land Management.

9. Economic Integration: How will this project improve OHV recreation opportunities that help local, regional, or state economies grow?

Fewer impacts result in more funding available to expand trail systems and build new facilities rather than having to repair damaged ones. Furthermore, improved behavior results in greater opportunities rather than closures. The Tread Lightly! Nevada Program will improve OHV recreation opportunities that help local, regional and state economies grow by employing our marketing and communications strategy throughout the state. Tread Lightly! has partnered with offices of tourism in several surrounding states to incorporate ethics messaging into their campaigns not only to encourage visitation but also provide education so that visitors know how to act once arriving. Improved information and facilities along with expanded opportunities results in greater visitation and economic impact.

10. Demand for New Facilities: Please provide justification for NEW facility/program development: restrooms, trails, signs, and other amenities.

Tread Lightly!'s application for a Nevada Program Manager will allow us to hire a local staff person dedicated to work in Nevada. While there are many opportunities to get involved, we are short staffed and have to prioritize work where financial support is available. Currently, the time invested in Nevada is absorbed by agreements with Federal agencies but the work load on existing staff is unsustainable. While Tread Lightly! will always strive to provide support to interested agency partners, we will be unable to provide consistent support without the state's financial investment.
